

OUTLOOK GREEN FAITH REPORT

We celebrated our Solar startup in January 2011, and here we are in Jan. 2016, having run the system for 5 years, with Hudson Solar Partners, and the dedicated leadership of John Walradt and George Schildge. It has been an exciting time for us to realize the benefits of green energy, through hurricanes, snowstorms, and heavy rains. Here are some stats. The solar power system has generated over 270,000 KWH of electrical energy (60% of church's power requirements). This production has made it possible to avoid emissions of nearly 460,000 pounds of carbon dioxide into the atmosphere. We have also worked to raise awareness and shift to "greener" cleaning materials, installed new windows for better energy conservation, reduced waste by using less disposable dinnerware, and shifted to higher efficiency lighting that uses less electricity.

Now, in this new year, please think about how each of us can shrink our carbon footprint on the planet. If you are thinking of a new appliance, be sure to check the energy efficiency. How about a new car - what is the gasoline efficiency, or how about an electric or a hybrid. And think about waste as well. Some recent statistics on food waste are shocking. Americans throw away 40% of total food consumption! This is in comparison to so many of our fellow humans who have to search for scraps on the street, or just eat whatever they can grow or find that is edible. So let's make a pledge to be good stewards of the bounty we have, and be aware if how we can share some of our abundance with fellow travelers on the earth.

Please share your ideas on steps we can take to encourage less fossil fuel and more green energy as we continue our journey to be better stewards of our planet Earth. Save the date of Sunday, April 17th for our spring Green Fair in Fellowship Hall.

We pack the backpacks for The Backpack Crew every Wednesday night before program. We will host coffee hour on Sunday, March 6th. If you are 18-29 please join us at 6:15 pm to pack backpacks and 7 pm for program. We'd love to have you join us!

Sunday School: We have an active SS program during the 10:30 worship service after The Children's Sermon. Our groups are Nursery, Toddlers, K-3rd, 4th-6th, and High School at the 9:30 hour. Our HS students are looking at the New Testament and how and when it was written. The High School SS class owns leadership of the 4th Sunday Service with God Squad, our HS Youth Group. We need substitute SS teachers. Please see Elaine if you can help?

Thank you to Leslie Young, our new Nursery Care worker at the 10:30 hour. Thank you to Molly McGroary for subbing when needed in the nursery. We have 4 teens that help out in Sunday School in the toddler room and the K-3 class. Thank you to Shannon Foreback, Molly McGroary, Chloe Gartside and Parlin Gressitt for always being willing to help. These teens are working on a rotational basis so as not to miss worship every week.
