ear Church Family,

The month of May was a season of conferencing within our denomination, with General Conference (GC - the world-wide legislative body of our church) meeting from the 10<sup>th</sup> through the 20<sup>th</sup> in Portland, Oregon, followed immediately by the Greater New Jersey Annual Conference (AC) session, which met in Wildwood from the 22<sup>nd</sup> through the 24<sup>th</sup>. While AC decisions impact the local church through our conference structure and functions, it is the GC that impacts who we are as United Methodists and how we live and work together on a denominational level.

There were many, many, many decisions made throughout GC, and it will take some time to process through the impacts of each of them. Some of the decisions are more obvious, for example sacramental authority was granted for deacons, like our Minister of Visitation Rev. Christina Zito, upon the approval of the Bishop – meaning she will now be able to take communion to our shut ins when she visits, or perform a baptism at the church. Another vote put us on track to get our first new hymnal since 1989, and this one will be Internet-cloud based and print-on-demand—the first high-tech hymnal for a mainline denomination.

For the first time in the history of our denomination, the GC delegates asked the Council of Bishops for their guidance and leadership through the human sexuality debate. Instead of trying to legislate our way through the debate, the Bishops suggested a special commission be formed to completely examine and possibly recommend revisions of every paragraph in *The Book of Discipline* related to human sexuality, and if necessary, call a special session of GC in 2018 or 2019 to deal with such proposals. These recommendations were approved, which effectively closed all conversations around human sexuality. While this development means that our denominational stance on human sexuality, marriage equality, and the ordination of LGBTQ pastors has not changed, it means that nothing has gotten worse. The development of this commission indicates that we are finally "officially" recognizing the struggle and intend to do something about it.

I am hopeful that through the conversations that will happen and recommendations that will be made by this commission, we as a denomination can move forward into the future, living our commitment to justice and equality for all God beloved children. We will still need to surround this debate in prayer and communicate our passion for equality to our neighbors, letting them know over and over again, that all are welcome and loved at the United Methodist Church of Red Bank!

May God bless us on the journey ahead!
