Thank you to everyone who sent in a letter supporting our LGBTQ+ brothers and sisters for the *It's Time Campaign*. Our congregation sent in 42 of the 50 letters from the NJ Conference. A group of fifteen of us attended a general conference delegate listening session on April 12 in Neptune. Nine of us spoke about our desire for the conference delegates to uphold the vote on the 6 resolutions on human sexuality that were passed at the Greater NJ Conference last year. We expressed our love for our denomination, but the frustration and pain that has been caused for over 40 years by our denomination's lack of inclusion of our LGBTQ+ brothers and sisters in Christ.

Bishop Schol posted a response to a letter from Heisler Memorial. You can find the Bishop's letter here http://bit.ly/1YzSwiv The Heisler

Memorial letter is at http://bit.ly/1WxHPj2. The Heisler Memorial letter is encouraging the General Conference delegates to vote against the 6 human sexuality resolutions that were passed. I wrote personally to the Bishop expressing my disappointment in his posting of the letter without reaching out to the side that carried the majority vote. I would encourage anyone who wants full equality in our denomination to write to the Bishop and our delegates that will be representing us in Portland. Please either email your letter to me (I am putting together packets for each delegate) or send them directly to the delegates. I have posted copies of the contact information for the delegates on the Reconciling bulletin board. I can also email you that information. Please see the bulletin board for copies of everything.

It is time for us to help other United Methodist churches in greater New Jersey move through the reconciling process. We are looking for new committee members to help us with this.
