

Fall is now upon us; the air is turning brisk, and the leaves have begun to fall, creating a crunchy blanket underfoot. As this time of transition picks up steam and we are surrounded by the sights and sounds of the season – pumpkin spice and apple cinnamon – we also enter into the traditional fall season of the church – STEWARDSHIP. While the timing of our Stewardship Campaign aids our finance committee in planning for church wide ministry in the upcoming year and developing a faithful budget, I believe that stewardship has much more to do with our spiritual growth and faith-life.

Stewardship encompasses more than what we place in the offering plate as it is passed on Sunday mornings. Rather, it stretches to our relationship with money and possessions, how we feel about sharing our resources with others, and working to develop a healthy balance. While people often are uncomfortable talking about money in church, it is a topic that Jesus did not shy away from - but rather tackled head on. He knew that our relationship with money and resources has the potential to weigh us down, holding us back from faithfulness of life, or it has the capability to free us for joyful generosity.

This month, our church wide stewardship emphasis is entitled *Defying Gravity: Break Free from the* Culture of More. We will look critically at our relationship with money and the way it holds us back. We will also celebrate the many ways our generosity as individuals and as a church transforms hearts and lives every day. Each week in worship, we will hear reflections from individuals who have been impacted by, or witnessed the impact of, the ministries and missions our church supports. I am looking forward to hearing the testimonies of these individuals and seeing the blessings our ministry brings forth in the lives and communities around us.

At the end of the stewardship program, you will be asked to fill out and return a commitment card. We do this for two reasons. First, it allows the church to plan accurately for ministries, since we can base our ministry budget on the dollar amount our members plan to give. Second, the act of filling out a card is a way of inviting you to set a goal for giving during the coming year. Committing yourself to financially supporting the church symbolizes the priority you place on returning back to God some of the blessings you have received. I look forward to seeing what God is able to accomplish through each of us working together in a spirit of generosity!

Thank you for all you do to further the mission and work of The United Methodist Church of Red Bank. You make a difference here!

Gifts of Stocks or Securities

Rather than give cash to the Church, some folks meet some or all of their annual giving by transferring appreciated stock or securities to the Church. Rather than sell the stock, and take a tax hit, you transfer the stock to the Church's endowment fund. Once the Endowment fund receives the transfer, it sells the shares and forwards the proceeds to the Church, where it is recorded like any other Church contribution you make.

Charlie and I did this for the first time for our 2016 giving. It's no problem to also indicate how you'd like your contribution to be split if you also want to cover a gift to Outreach or to the ASP Mission team or whatever in addition to your general offering. Sheila can take your directions on that.

Either George Schildge or John Walradt can give you a form to help you get started on the transfer to our endowment account and provide general guidance on the process.
