Another summer has sped by and as I write, it feels as if we are standing at the start line of a race, eagerly anticipating the exciting season ahead! This September is a special one in the life of our church – we are celebrating 75 years of ministry in our current building. While our faith community is quite a bit older, being organized in 1864, the cornerstone of the Sanctuary at 247 Broad Street was dedicated 75 years ago this month.

As we celebrate together all the ministry and mission that has been made possible by our spacious and beautiful church building, we remember that none of it would have happened without the amazing people that make up this church. As a child, I sang the song, "The church is not a building, the church is not a steeple, the church is not a resting place, the church is the people. I am the church, you are the church, we are the church together. All who follow Jesus, all around the world. Yes, we're the church together!" Thank you, to each and everyone one of you who has lived out this spirit of BEING the church in action.

Our amazing church building is one of the tools that we, the church, use to be in ministry to our community and the world. Our doors are open to an ever growing number of 12-step and community-based groups. Just in the past two years, I have seen our facilities be used for a nursery school, a folk dancing group, counseling services, educational opportunities, musical programs, local association gatherings, an art class, a voting site, and that doesn't even include how our congregation utilizes our space for worship, Christian education, mission and ministry, outreach, and community service. While the expenses that go along with the upkeep and maintenance of a facility like ours are not insignificant, they truly are ministry funds offered as gifts for God's continued work here through the UMC of Red Bank.

We invite you to join in the celebration of our 75th Anniversary through two different Sundays' events. On the 11th, we will worship together at 9:30 a.m. followed by a potluck picnic on the front lawn. The men's "Helping Hands" ministry will have the grill churning out hot dogs, burgers, veggie burgers, and ribs, but we are asking people to bring sides, salads, and desserts to accompany the BBQ.
