Dear Church Family,

Even though it feels like we were just celebrating Christmas, Lent is already upon us. Our Lenten season begins this year with our Ash Wednesday services on February 14. Beginning on this day of repentance, we enter into a season of contemplation and inward searching, preparing our hearts and lives for the heart-wrenching journey of Holy Week.

This year, our Lenten worship series entitled Listen will invite us into the spiritual practices of deep listening – listening to our bodies, our scriptures, our heart, our brokenness and need for healing, and the still small voice of God that speaks, often beyond words. As we journey together into deep and reflective listening, I invite you to open your heart and mind, allowing the Spirit of God to work within – illumining those places we frequently overlook in our lives.

So often we get stuck in the mode of talking AT God – mostly through prayer, as we pour our wishes and sometimes even demands out, expecting God to respond in just the way we desire. While there is nothing wrong with pouring your heart out to God, a step we too often forget is LISTENING. Listening for what God is saying in the midst of life. Most say they have never heard the voice of God, so they don't know what to listen for... but I believe that God communicates through more than just words. God is reaching out to us all the time, amid the created world, the words of Scripture, the emotions and intuitions within our own spirit, and through our everyday experiences. God is always communicating with us... the question is, are we listening?

It is my prayer that through our Lenten journey, you will enter into a spirit of deep listening, for as Margaret Wheatley wrote, "Listening moves us closer, it helps us become more whole, more healthy, more holy." May we all emerge from this Lenten journey on a closer walk with God, centered in the love of Christ, and fueled by the power of the Holy Spirit. Amen!

May God's blessing and peace be yours along the journey.

2017 Financials and Thoughts on Sustainability

Our 2017 year-end deficit was \$24,956, about 1/3 lower than the \$37,820 deficit we expected as we began the year. Thanks to all who gave generously as the year closed, including holiday giving, Close the Deficit giving (which totaled \$6089 for the year) and Building Use which has been strong all year. Shout outs as well to the HUBOB team which brought in a total of \$3,033 in 2017. We should also note that two members, Tiffany McCann and Janet Tartaglia generously lead Yoga and Fitness classes each week which now contribute to Building Use.

Now we turn our sights to 2018. How do we create a more sustainable future for ourselves? How do we set up patterns of giving and income so that The United Methodist Church of Red Bank remains strong and steady in its support of our community and in support of the causes dear to us? Sustainability is relevant to so many issues in our world, from the environment and our use of the natural resources given to our world, to our personal finances and business operating models. As you give in 2018, be mindful of giving on a regular basis. Can you set up your checking account to send a contribution each paycheck or each month to the church? (That's what Charlie and I do – the bank mails the check to the Church once a month.) Or use our online giving option to set up a regular contribution. Automating your giving is one great way to set up a steady pattern of giving on your part, and sustainable and predictable finances for the Church. And automated giving means you're never behind if you are absent from church for a while.

Please continue to be in prayer for our Church, for its programs to be sustained through the coming years, and for its finances. Give generously whenever you can, and always spend thoughtfully. Thank you again for your strong giving at the end of 2017.
