Dear Church Family,

Holy Week is at the heart of the Christian story. Our worship and mission, the foundation of our belief system, and our traditions as a community of faith are grounded in, lead to, and spring from this week. It is my prayer that through worship and community, you may walk closely with Jesus, reflecting on how our faith transforms you from the inside out and gives you hope through even the darkest days.

Together, may we journey through life and faith, through the darkness of holy week to the hope and joy of resurrection this Easter!

Visit to another House of Faith in the Community....Janie and George Schildge

Four of our 8th Graders going through confirmation have been introduced to the Islamic Society of Monmouth County through several events. Kenny Blake, Jim Mellon, and the Schildges attended Friday night prayers at the Masjid on March 10th, and were warmly received by members of the Congregation. On Saturday March 18th a group went over to help make lunches for Elijah's Kitchen and homeless shelter, including Sam Jansky, Tom and Grace Davidson, Lily Ferrone and her friend, Paige, and the Schildges. 400 sandwiches were made in an assembly line, while another line produced salads in a cup, and all were bagged up and ready to be delivered the same afternoon. The youngest helper was Sama, a first grader there, and Schildges were the oldest, and we shared stories of our visit to the Alhambra in Granada, Spain, built by the Moors in Andalucia during the seven centuries they ruled there. Their architectural skills left magnificent gardens and pools around the residences of the rulers. In 1829 Washington Irving, a famous American writer, had an apartment in the abandoned palace and wrote poetry about the Alhambra. He later became the Ambassador to Spain.

We hope to do some more projects with this congregation and get to know each other better and learn about the countries from which they have come and more about their faith tenets.
