Dear Church Family,

As time continues to zoom by us, we enter once again into the season of Lent, a time of reflection and deep soul searching, a time to prepare our hearts and spirits for the roller coaster leading up to Easter. As the weeks unfold, from Ash Wednesday through Lent, to holy week and beyond, we are invited on a journey of spiritual discovery, a time set aside to look around and within, reflecting on where we find ourselves in this season of life.

In worship, we will be exploring the spiritual landscapes of Lent and using the elements we find in scripture to focus our reflections. Landscapes are something we often take for granted, the earth that surrounds us and its impact on us. Whether we realize it or not, our surroundings impact us and can help us reflect on our spiritual journey. As we focus together on the scriptural landscapes of Lent and the elements we find there, wilderness, wind, water, cave, and palms, we have the opportunity to look around at our own lives, to embrace this season of reflection and soul searching. I pray that you will enter this Lenten journey with an open heart and mind, ready and willing to dig deep, to reflect, to wander the landscapes that surround you in daily life and in scripture.

May we journey together in this season knowing that God is with us!

March 1946 saw the congregation dedicate themselves to the support of their own personal missionaries to China, Tracy Jones and his wife, Martha Clayton Jones, a member of the church. An annual pledge was made to support this couple and additional funds were raised to send them bicycles for use in their work. A high point in this period occurred in November, 1947 when a phone call was placed to the couple in Nanking. A telephone was installed in the church chancel so that the actual call might take place during the Sunday morning worship service, in that way, the entire congregation might share in the thrill of that historic moment. - from "A Bicentennial Glimpse of the United Methodist Church of Red Bank
