Dear Church Family,

We have started the season off with a bang, getting back into the swing of the full ministry of the church after the summer. Not only have we returned to our multiple worship service schedule, be we've added The Village service, increasing our Sunday morning programing to 3 back-to-back services – 8:15, 9:30, and 11:00 AM. Plastic objects that we use once and discard, or single use plastics, have become a problem of global proportion:

*By 2025, only 7½ years from now, it is estimated that we will generate 6 million tons a day of solid waste.

* Less than 10% of plastic is recycled.

- * Single use plastics linger for years polluting and shedding microscopic particles which are now found in many water systems and the food chain. When we consume fish or other animal products, we could also be consuming plastic itself.
- * Plastics are also injuring animals and marine life. Pieces of plastic of all sizes have been found in even the most remote marine and environments.
 - * Soon there will be more plastic than fish in our oceans measured by weight!
- * Plastic straws are actually Styrofoam, and are the worst thing to use to sip your cool drinks. They never go away! Please do not use them!
