Dear Church Family,

Christ is Risen! Christ is Risen Indeed!

Yes, I know Easter Sunday was celebrated mid-April, but even into May, we find ourselves in the season of Eastertide – the 40 days between Easter and Pentecost when we continue to celebrate Christ's resurrection. We are Easter people who believe deeply about God's resurrecting power, not just in the life of Jesus, but in our lives as well. When hope seems lost, when the darkness of life's challenges seems like they could swallow us whole, we focus on our faith in new life, new hope, and God's power to overcome even the most impossible situation with love.

In worship throughout the season of Eastertide, we are unpacking the metaphor of a butterfly emerging from a chrysalis, transformed from an earthbound caterpillar to a beautiful winged butterfly. So often in our daily lives, we find ourselves stuck in a dark period of waiting... We too are like a chrysalis waiting in seemingly endless darkness. Easter is about *hope* that is willing to wait in the darkness, all the while trusting in God's promise of transformation. This is expressed by Joyce Rupp in an excerpt of her poem, *The Easter Challenge:*

Every year cocoons give us their treasures,
And every year
the dull and dead in us
meets our Easter challenge:
to be open to the unexpected,
to believe beyond our security,
to welcome God in every form,
And trust in our own greening.

As this Easter season continues to unfold around us, it is my prayer that we continue hoping in the midst of darkness, that we open our hearts and lives to God's possibilities, to the unexpected, and that we trust in God's guidance and transformation, leading us into resurrection and new life.

Attention All Church Members!

On Sunday, April 23rd we held a very successful "*Pancakes for Potholes*" Breakfast Fundraiser. It was part of the effort to raise funds to allow us to professionally repair the numerous potholes and cracks, remill appropriate surface portions of the driveway and parking lot, to seal the complete area, and to repaint all parking areas.

Let me share some specifics:

1) <u>20 volunteers</u> - perhaps more, but that was all I was able to count - <u>did everything</u> from shopping (some even in NC!) to baking (bacon and sausage, as well as loads of pastries), to stirring, to cooking (weren't those pancakes and waffles yummy?), to setting-up (20 tables and 96 places

- were set in place!), to serving (continuously while keeping the coffee hot and the juice flowing), to the final clearing and cleaning-up. What a whirlwind of activity, and the energy was electric! Even more amazing were the smiles on these volunteers as they hurried about.
- 2) The <u>energy and enthusiasm of the partakers of this breakfast was amazing!</u> It was a sight to behold! They were obviously enjoying both the food and each other's company!
- 3) The <u>generosity of the donations was amazing!</u> On Sunday alone, from the breakfast donation, we received <u>\$3,676</u>. Combined with the previously received donations, we now have a total of **\$10,103.00** donated toward the Parking Lot Repair Campaign.

To summarize, we now have <u>68%</u> of our goal of \$15,000 (the estimate to do the work). While we are very near to being able to commit to this project, for clarity, we are not fully there! So, in the near-term, we will continue to monitor what contributions come-in, especially from members who haven't had the chance to contribute, and from other users of our church.

Additionally, this project's status will be presented to the Finance Committee, Trustees, and Church Council for further review.

In conclusion, I personally want to express my gratitude to all who have been so positive and helpful in getting us to this point. Thank you!

A Look Back





- Bulletin from a service: Thursday September 20, 1888 2:30 p.m. The service was titled "Laying the Corner Stone of the Grace M. E. Church.
- A list: A small piece of paper listing: Board of Commissioners, a Town Committee, and a list of area churches and their leaders.
- Newspaper: The New Jersey Standard, Thursday, September 13, 1888
- Newspaper: Red Bank Register, Wednesday, September 12, 1888
- Newspaper: The Christian Advocate, New York, Thursday September 20, 1888.

Pictured are the front and back of the bulletin, and the handwritten list.

Would whomever dropped off the time capsule please contact me as I would love to get some context surrounding the artifact. Where was it found? Who has held onto it? Who opened it and when? Thanks.
