Dear Church Family,

We have had a challenging start to 2018 in our nation; from the continued racial tension, to the uncertainty of the future of Dreamers within our communities, to the uncovering of gender discrimination and voicing of the #MeToo movement, to the continued gun violence that plagues our schools and society as a whole. If we had thought for a moment that we were further along in our march toward a more just and peaceful society than our current reality reveals, then our recent history has awoken us from that dream with abrupt certainty. What do we do when we find ourselves in the midst of such turmoil surrounding us? I believe the answer is two-fold: we reach in and strengthen the convictions of our faith, and we reach out, building bridges where some would erect walls, and using our voices and very presence to speak up to the powers of injustice.

We begin by reaching in, reconnecting with the heart of our Gospel, grounded in the love of God. We re-center our focus on God and what it means to live out the Kingdom of God in our everyday lives. We do this by quieting the noise and strife long enough to connect with God, to refuel and re-enliven our faith. In March, our Lenten worship series will be inviting us on a journey of listening for God’s still small voice, which is too often drowned out by the clamor of the world. I pray that through this time of worship and the weekly invitation to practice a spiritual discipline, you may be blessed to reach in and emerge revitalized, grounded in God’s love, and ready to face the challenges that lie ahead.

The second movement that we lean towards in times of struggle is to reach out, making connections and relationships with other individuals and groups, remembering that we are not alone in the struggle. In this spirit, we celebrate the success of our first Forum on Social Justice, focused on Race, which we hosted on January 25th. The 90 people in attendance (30 of the UMCRB members) were blessed with an opportunity to hear from our guest speakers Sid Bernstein, Rev. Gil Caldwell, and Gilda Rodgers and to be in conversation with one another about our heartbreaks and our hopes, using our history and present struggles as a jumping off point for solutions in the future. While we did not solve the plague of racism in our nation, or even in our community, we took a step in the right direction. As we move into the future, there remain a lot of steps before us, but I pray that the relationships and conversations that were started through this forum may continue to grow and thrive as we work together to bring forth the kingdom of God in our midst. We will continue this forum’s model of reaching out, building connections and opening up dialogue on April 29th as we tackle the topic of Gender Equality, so mark your calendar.

As the world around us continues to spin in chaos and struggle, may you reach in and remain centered in the love of God, and may you reach out in connection with others.

May God's blessing and peace be yours along the journey.


