Dear Church Family,

I don't know about you, but I really need spring this year! I need to see the promise of new life bursting forth around us... the ever present hope that cannot be stopped by even the coldest, darkest, longest winter. Such proof found in the natural world reminds me of the power of hope and resurrection – the power of Easter, which is right around the corner.

Surrounded by the struggle within our denomination around LGBTQ inclusion, and in the wider scope of the world – the fear and violence that leads to tragedies like the mass shooting in New Zealand – we need to hold onto the hope of Easter resurrection. Our conviction that sin, hatred, and grief DO NOT have the last word draws our focus to the future, to what *can be* rather than simply what *is*. Out of the ruins of the 2019 General Conference, I believe that God is doing a new thing. It is about life and not death. It is about love and not hate or exclusion. Easter is about the pain of the cross leading to the joy of an empty tomb. It is about God's grace and love and goodness that cannot be stopped.

As we wait for Judicial Council rulings to see how much of the punitive policies of the Traditional plan will actually come into effect in January of 2020, those who oppose the 2019 General Conference decisions are hard at work. We are networking and planning together like never before. People who have until now remained silent are standing up for justice and inclusion, recognizing that silence means complicit acceptance. I invite you to join the resistance, to sign on to the Greater New Jersey Statement that is accessible from our website and Facebook page. Don't give up hope that God will lead us forward into a brighter, more inclusive future.

May God's spirit of resurrection and new life blow in and through us this Easter season!
