Dear Church Family,

Restoration experts in northern England have been working hard to uncover and preserve the treasures of 500 year-old Auckland Castle. Last year, they exposed the original framing around a door between the butler's pantry and the dining room. Inscribed in the wooden panel above the door were the words *Est Deo Gracia*, a Latin phrase meaning "Thanks be to God." Every time guests looked toward the kitchen and saw food coming to the table, they were prompted to thank God for what they were about to receive.

Wouldn't it be great to engrave that phrase on our hearts? Recognizing every blessing that comes our way as a gift from God and saying, "Thanks be to God!"

Gratitude is an attitude that can reclaim our spirits in times of disappointment or distress. However bleak our circumstances, we can always find reasons to

say: "Thanks be to God." That little phrase can bear us through difficulty and remind us that no matter how hard things get, there will always be something that we can look to and be thankful for.

This November in worship, we will focus on the attitude of gratitude, saying over and over again, "Thanks be to God." As is our tradition, we will read the names of all who have passed away this year, and those who have joined the church community of saints through baptism. Over the following weeks, we will lift thanks for God's gifts of creation, scripture, and generosity.

I hope you will join us on this journey of thanksgiving, for a grateful heart lifts our spirits, and centers our focus on what God is doing in and around us. Whatever you're going through today, I invite you to take a deep breath, count your blessings, and say five times: "Thanks be to God!"

May God's blessings surround you and yours as we lift prayers of thanks and praise!





Our very own Ken Glossbrenner got this year's CROP Walk off and running, er *walking*, when he cut the ribbon at the 39<sup>th</sup> Annual Red Bank CROP Walk on Oct. 20<sup>th</sup>. Although it rained during the walk, the weather couldn't dampen our spirits or determination to help those in need. We counted over 40 teams that included two teams led by UMCRB God Squad teens Julia Sullivan and Dillon McCann. Although we haven't yet heard the final totals, we hope to reach our \$100,000 goal and went well beyond our food goal by collecting more than 17,000 pounds of food!
