
I am pleased to share we have made considerable progress this year on our way to a balanced operating budget. Our income is running higher than this time last year as a result of both increased giving and increased building use income. In addition, our expenses are running lower than this time last year primarily as a result of significant volunteer time contributed toward office support and lawn/landscaping maintenance. The results of these combined efforts put us well within striking distance of closing 2019 with a balanced budget!

In addition to this good news, our 2020 Stewardship Campaign is in full swing and our pledged giving currently stands at over \$289,000 which means we are at 95% of our \$300,000 goal.

Thank you Red Bank Methodists of all ages. To date, CROP Walk #39 has raised over \$101,000 to help our 15 local partners fighting hunger and reaching out around the world. We also collected 17,000 pounds of food that went out to 24 local pantries to fill their shelves. This was a record year and we did it in the rain!

LIBRARY NEWS

New books in our Church Library include three books for ages 8-12 years (grades 3-7) donated by Helen Vetter.

The Adventures of a Girl Called Bicycle by Christina Uss (860 Lexile) is the story of a 12-year old girl named Bicycle who was raised in a Washington D.C. monastery. She absolutely does not want to go to camp and learn how to make friends. Instead she takes off on a cross-country quest to meet her idol, a famous cyclist, and discovers much about herself on the journey.

Bob by Wendy Mass and Rebecca Stead (590 Lexile) tells of Livy's visit to her grandmother's home in Australia. At her last visit five years ago, she had met Bob, a shorty greenish creature dressed in a chicken suit who had been hiding in a closet at Gram's house waiting for Livy to return. It's a tale of magic, mystery, friendship, identity and belonging.

Endling the Last: Book One by Katherine Applegate (690 Lexile) tells the story of Byx who fears she may be the last of her species, a mythical doglike species that has been hunted to near extinction in the wartorn kingdom of Nedarra. As Byx seeks safe haven, she meets new allies (animals and humans) along the way.
