A time for spiritual renewal and rest...

For pastors, ministry is more than a job; it is a vocation, a way of life, and one that impacts all aspects of life. I have had the privilege of serving in full time ministry for nearly 10 years; 4 in Haddonfield and I'm working on my 6th year here in Red Bank. I love what I do and feel like God made me to be a pastor, but there is a heavy weight that comes with ministry, both emotionally and spiritually. In the midst of the weekly "grind" of church work, it is challenging to balance the regular need for rest and spiritual recharging, along with the demands of being the mother of young children.

As pastors, we are encouraged to practice self-care and warned of the results of its neglect. Anthony Headley in his article "Self-Care in Ministry" for *Catalyst Resources* says, "[The] failure in self-care often carries devastating consequences. It contributes to unmanageable stress, spiritual and emotional exhaustion, and even premature exit from ministry." The *Book of Discipline* recognizes the need for clergy to take a respite from the normal exercise of pastoral ministry and makes provisions for both Renewal Leaves (shorter term) and Sabbatical leaves (longer and more structured). With the full support of our District Superintendent and the entire cabinet, as well as the SPRC (Staff Parish Relations Committee) and Church Council of UMCRB, I will be taking a Renewal Leave from January 21st through February 16th, 2020.

Renewal Time is not "empty" or unstructured time, but a set aside time when I will be focused on spiritual renewal, physical rest and refreshment, emotional recharging, and intellectual stimulation. I will be spending some time away alone to read and pray, walk and reflect, as well as some time away with my family. It is my prayer and expectation that I will return to you mid-February refreshed and renewed in body, mind, and spirit and ready to lead afresh, which will benefit me as a person and pastor, as well as the church. I ask that you surround me if prayer during this season of spiritual growth as I focus on deepening my relationship with God, myself, and my family.

In my absence, I am leaving the congregation in good hands as Rev. David Henritzy has graciously offered to serve as interim Senior Pastor during my Renewal Leave. He will be preaching one of the Sundays, will other guest preachers, including our DS, Rev. Christina Zito, and my mother, Rev. Vicki Brendler covering the other three weeks. When we meet our goal of 500 lbs, TREX[®] will donate an outdoor bench for use on our Pre-K playground and together we will have eliminated unwanted plastic from our area landfills! Any plastic marked with a 2 or 4 recycle symbol can be donated. A good rule of thumb is plastic that can be stretched is acceptable, plastic that crinkles is not. Universally accepted items are: Pallet wrap and stretch film • Grocery bags • Bread bags • Case overwrap •Dry cleaning bags • Newspaper sleeves • Ice bags • Wood pellet bags • Ziploc® food storage bags • Produce bags • Bubble wrap and air pillows • Salt bags • Cereal bags • Plastic shipping envelopes

Please note, it is VERY IMPORTANT that ALL materials are CLEAN, DRY AND FREE OF FOOD RESIDUE!
